As players progress to the Under 9 and Under 10 age groups, the captain's armband takes on a more substantial role.

It becomes a symbol of responsibility.

Youngsters at this stage start to grasp the significance of their role within the team.

They understand that they must set a good example both on and off the field.

This budding sense of responsibility helps them develop a stronger work ethic, and they take pride in being dependable leaders.

U9's: Captain for a month (4 games). The player that has shown leadership in training and in games, the player that has worked hard and has performed better than previously.

The Captain now gets added responsibility such as leading the pre match warm ups and giving their vote of MOTM to the coach.

They also get to nominate 2 players to potentially take over as Captain after them and have to give 2 reasons why.

U10's: All of the above, and leading a pre match huddle before kick off to make sure every player is ready.

Encourage the captain to compliment their teammates and maintain a positive morale even if things are difficult on the pitch,

Under 11 and Under 12: Shaping Attitude

By the time players reach Under 11 and Under 12, they have a more developed understanding of the game and the importance of teamwork.

The captain's armband becomes a powerful tool for shaping attitude.

Those wearing it understand that their actions can influence the entire team's mindset. This instills an attitude of commitment and determination.

Captains begin to lead not only by example but also vocally, motivating their teammates and fostering a positive mindset even in the face of challenges.

U11's: Let the captain have their own 30 seconds of a team talk to inspire their players.

U12's: Looking for a leader voted by their peers. Continue with a monthly captain but allow the squad to choose, along with your own input. Have a team discussion.

Under 13 and Up: Emphasizing Respect

As players advance to the Under 13 age group and beyond, they become more aware of the complexities of the game, including rules, sportsmanship, and the value of respect.

The captain's armband carries a heightened sense of responsibility for setting the tone in terms of respectful behavior.

Captains at this stage are expected to lead by demonstrating respect for the game, referees, opponents, and their teammates.

They set the standard for fair play and sportsmanship.
